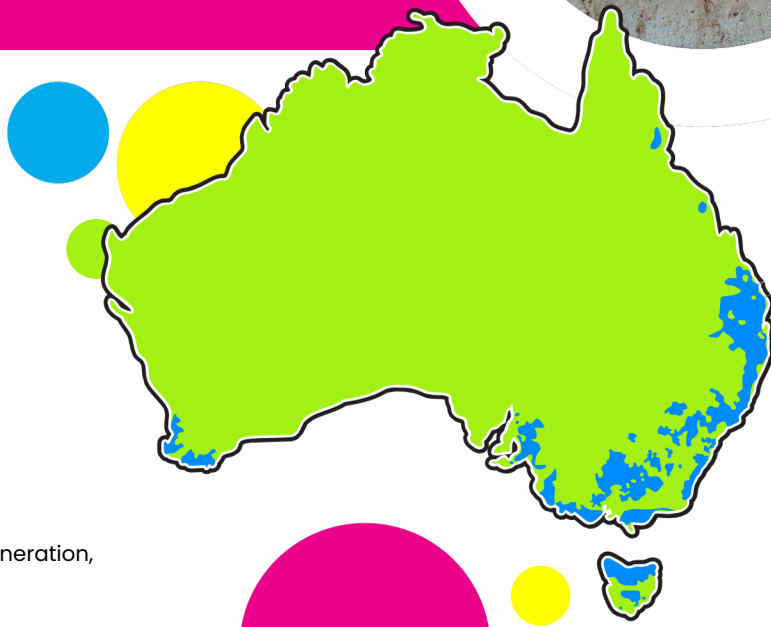

- 3:30pm** You have finished your day and have the afternoon off.



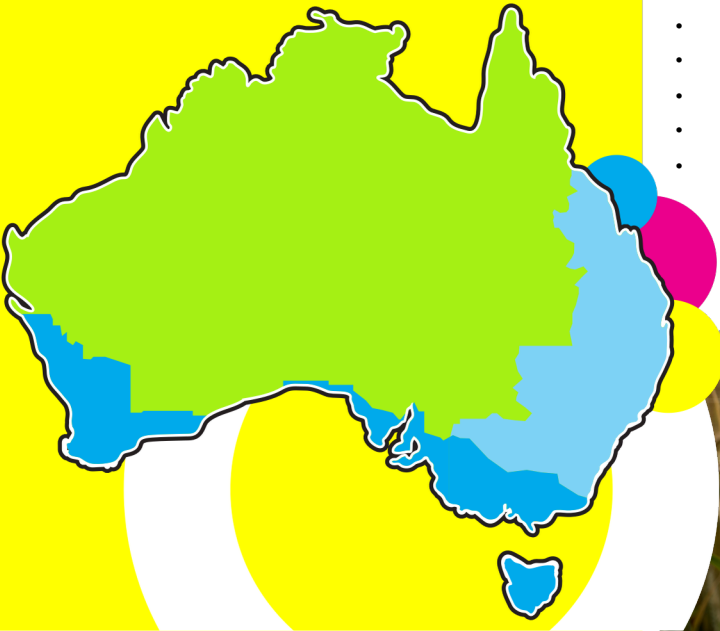

12:30pm

Lunch time!

1:30pm

Grab your tools and help with general farm maintenance.

3:30pm

Head to the sheds to check the chickens are ready for the night.

5:00pm

You are done!

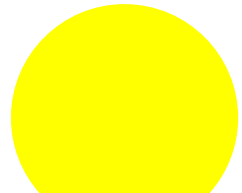
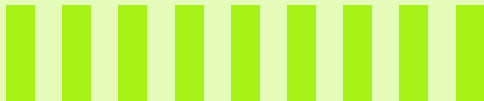
PIG FARM
